VISITING FOREIGN MINISTER SAYS WON'T COMPROMISE ON HAMAS

Israel calls for long-term strategic ties with India

SHUBHAJIT ROY New Delhi, November 4

AS DELHI REAFFIRMED its support for the Gaza peace plan while underlining that "our two nations face a particular challenge from terrorism", visiting Israeli Foreign Minister Gideon

Tuesday and said Israel and India are "building a long-term strategic partnership". Jaishankar responded saying, "India and Israel have a strategic partnership and, par-

ticularly in our case, that term

has a real meaning." Besides counter-terrorism and security cooperation, the two ministers discussed enhanced cooperation in cybersecurity and semiconductors, participation of Indian companies in rail, road and port infrastructure in Israel, renewable energy and health, Israeli innovation in agriculture in India, and more Indian skilled workers

in Israel. Sa'ar, who recalled that Prime Minister Narendra Modiwas the first world leader to call Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu after the October 7, 2023 attack by Hamas, said the "eradication of the Hamas terror state is at the heart of (US) President (Donald) Trump's Plan" and "we won't compromise on it".

Jaishankar said, "We have stood together in testing times... Our two nations face a particular challenge from terrorism. It is essential that we work towards ensuring a global approach of zero-tolerance towards terrorism, in all its forms and manifestations.

"We have naturally been following developments in your region with very close attention. We welcome the return of the hostages and the remains of those who unfortunately lost their lives. India supports the Gaza Peace Plan and hopes that

it paves the way for a durable and lasting solution,"he said.

Recalling the Hamas attack in which 1,200 people were killed and around 250 taken hostage two years ago, Sa'ar said, "We appreciate Prime Minister Modi's strong solidarity. We remember that he was the first world leader to call Prime Minister Netanyahu after Hamas' October 7th massacre. We won't forget it.

"Radical terror is a mutual threat to Israel and India. We strongly condemn the horrific terror attack in Pahalgam," he said, making common cause on the shared concern.

"In the Middle East, Israel faces a unique phenomenon: 'terror states'. The radical terror states of Hamas in Gaza, Hezbollah in Lebanon and the Houthis in Yemen have established themselves over the past decades. Uprooting them is necessary for the security and stability of our region," he said.

"The eradication of the Hamas terror state is at the heart of President Trump's Plan.

Hamas must be disarmed. Gaza must be demilitarised. We won't compromise on it," Sa'ar said.

He met National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and, in a post on X, said, "Honoured to meet the National Security Advisor of India, Ajit Doval, in New Delhi. We discussed ways to cooperate and confront our common challenges, especially the mutual threat of terror. We're building a long-term strategic partnership between Israel and

In his talks with Jaishankar, he said, "I believe that India is the future.I told you that. India is the world's largest democracy and fastest growing economy. India is a global superpower. And Israel is a regional powerhouse. Our nations already share a warm friendship. Our goal is to build a long-term strategic partnership between Israel and India."

Jaishankar said, "India and Israel have a strategic partnership and particularly in our case, that term has a real meaning. We have stood together in testing times. And we have created a

relationship with a high degree of trust and of reliability."

In recent times, he said, "India has developed many new capabilities, especially in rail, road and port infrastructure, in renewable energy and in health. Our businesses are very keen to explore opportunities in Israel and we would certainly like to give that more attention.

"We also have a very strong record of working together in agriculture and in innovation. Taking that forward is very much in our mutual interest," he said.

"There is a history of cooperation in semiconductors and in cyber. That has become more relevant now. We are hosting the AI Impact Summit next year in February in India and look forward very much to Israel's presence," he said.

Indian workers, Jaishankar said, are also present in Israel in growing numbers as a result of mobility understandings. "They have some issues which need attention and I hope we can take that dimension of our ties forward,"he said.

Gopichand Hinduja, architect of a global empire, passes away


HINDUJA GROUP CHAIRMAN Gopichand P Hinduja, the second of the four Hinduja brothers who built one of India's largest business empires, passed awayattheage of 85 at a London hospital on Tuesday.

Fondly known as 'GP' in business circles, he took over as the Chairman of the Hinduja Group and Hinduja Automotive, UK after the demise of elder brother Srichand Hinduja in May 2023.

Born in 1940, GP Hinduja joined the family business in Mumbai in 1959. He was one of the architects of the transformation of the group from an Indo-Middle East trading operation into a multi-billion-dollar transnational conglomerate. His younger brother Prakash Hinduja is Chairman of Hinduja Group (Europe) and the youngest brother Ashok Hinduja is the Chairman of Hinduja Group of companies in India.

According to the *Sunday* Times Rich List, Gopichand Hinduja 'and family' is the richest person in the UK with a networth of £35.3 billion.

GPHinduja's business philosophy could be summed up in two words — common sense. One of his defining moves came with the group's acquisition of Gulf Oil

in 1984, followed by the bold purchase of a then-struggling Ashok Leyland in 1987 — marking one of the earliest and most significant NRI investments in India.Thatacquisitionwenton to become one of the most remarkable turnaround stories in Indian corporate history.

He was also the driving force

behind the group's expansion into the power and infrastructure sectors, leading its vision to build multi-gigawatt energy capacity across India. Under his leadership, the group strengthened its financial footprint through IndusInd Bank and more recently, the acquisition of Reliance General Insurance Company. He graduated from Bombay's Jai Hind College in 1959. He held an Honorary Doctorate of Law from the University of Westminster and Honorary Doctorate of Economics from Richmond College, London.

The Hinduja Group has become one of the largest diversified groups in the world, spanningall the continents. The group employs over 250,000 people and has offices in many key cities of the world and all the major cities in India. Andhra Pradesh had signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Hinduja Group for a cumulative investment of ₹20,000 crore on Monday.

courted controversies as the Hinduja name allegedly cropped up in the Bofors scandal. In 1987, Swedish newspaper Dagens Nyheter, quoting highly placed company sources in an original report, alleged that the Hindujas were recipients of the "commission" paid by Bofors in connection with winning the Bofors-India Howitzer contract in 1986. However, the Hindujas persistently denied their involvement in the Bofors scandal, with one of the brothers claiming in an interview that "there is a clear-cut conspiracy to malign the name of the family."

The once-closely knit Hinduja family also witnessed a rift in the recent past. The cause for the rift happened in 2014, when the four brothers signed a letter that assets held by one brother belonged to all. The three younger brothers allegedly tried to use the 2014 letter to take control of Hinduja Bank in Switzerland, which was in SP's sole name, resulting in the legal battle between SP's daughters and the three brothers.

The cracks in the family widened as the children of the four brothers started moving up the ladder and holding key positions in family businesses. GP Hinduja's son Sanjay Hinduja is the Chairman of Gulf Oil.

Ministers from across the 27-nation bloc are meeting in Brussels to try and get at least 15 to align their nationally-determined emissions targets in order to have a stronger negotiating position during the COP30 summit in Belem.

In February, she had announced an economic policy that some said eroded her 2019 Green Deal. But von der Leyen said in September that "the world can count on Europe's climate leadership" and pledged that the EU is "on our way to climate neutrality" and would slash carbon emissions by 90% by 2040.

The real war behind unreal deceptive images



eepfakes and synthetic media are unreal, but the battle in the mind and the damage to the body are real." We live in an age where truth is constantly rewritten by technology. Every scroll, swipe, and click carries light and darkness. The same digital tools that connect the world are now used to deceive

face of deception. The term refers to synthetic media created using artificial intelligence. Through machine learning, thousands of images and videos can be analyzed to replicate a person's voice, expressions, and gestures, producing highly realistic yet fabricated videos-a dangerous blend of technical precision and psychological manipulation.

Deepfakes are the latest

The explosion of information and AI has created a synthetic reality, fertile ground for misinformation and disinformation. The Mahabharata offers an ancient example: the false news of Ashwatthama's death altered the course of the

single lies into millions of digital illusions, spreading faster than truth

The real threat of deepfakes lies in human nature. People instinctively believe what they see, a trust now exploited in the digital age. In 2024, fake robocalls using an AI-generated version of President Joe Biden's voice urged voters to skip the New Hampshire primary. The synthetic voice was so precise, matching Biden's tone and inflection, that many believed genuine. Investigators traced the calls to a political disinformation Similarly, a doctored video of President Donald Trump inflammatory making remarks went viral, viewed millions of times before being debunked, fueling outrage

and polarization. In India, deepfake videos circulated during the 2024 elections, portraying leaders making false statements. Some mimicked press interactions, others appeared as leaked recordings. Despite fact-checking, they spread rapidly, reflecting organized psychological operations to undermine electoral trust.

Beyond politics, deepfakes are tools of harassment. In Europe and Asia, AI-generated pornographic videos target women, journalists, and activists, using publicly available photos to humiliate and silence. The technology is also used for crime. A Europol

executive deceived by a deepfake video conference, authorizing a \$25 million transfer to fraudsters.

Deepfakes are psychological weapons, eroding trust and distorting perception. Their danger lies in accessibility-AI tools allow anyone with basic skills to create convincing fakes in minutes, spreading to millions in seconds. Corrections cannot undo the damage of viral

Governments struggle to respond. The EU's AI Act regulates synthetic media, the U.S. drafts laws against malicious deepfakes, and India relies on the Information Technology Act, 2000, and other laws. Yet, these are reactive, not preventive. Technology outpaces law, and no algorithm can fully counter forgery software.

The best defense is a better-informed society. Awareness and digital literacy are crucial. Individuals must pause before sharing, verify before believing, and question before reacting. Healthy skepticism should be a habit, like looking both ways before crossing a street.

The battle against deepfakes is for the human mind. The technology may be unreal, but the psychological damage is painfully real.

The Municipal Nursing and Paramedical Staff Union, Mumbai, has strongly opposed a recent BMC directive mandating Maharashtra Paramedical Council registration for technicians at KEM Hospital. In a detailed representation to the Deputy Commissioner of the Public Health Department, the Union urged the BMC to withdraw the order, calling it unjustified, impractical, and

unfair to long-serving municipal employees.

The Union highlighted that instructions were circulated through WhatsApp, directing KEM Hospital's technical staff to register with the Paramedical Council. However, no official circular or government resolution supports this mandate for BMC's technician cadre. The Union emphasised that recruitment rules, qualification criteria, and appointment letters issued by the BMC do not mention Paramedical Council registration. Established in 2011, the Council introduced qualification criteria based on academic courses available at that time, long after many technicians joined the BMC.

Many technicians, employed 10 to 20 years before the Council's formation, lack the newly prescribed qualifications, as such specialised paramedical courses did not exist earlier. The Union argues that applying this rule retrospectively is unreasonable and discriminatory, causing confusion and enced staff. "The technicians who entered service long before the establishment of the Paramedical Council fulfilled all eligibility conditions prescribed by the BMC at that time. Forcing them now to comply with new regulations framed years later is neither practical nor justified," the letter stated.

Travel nod to Parekh with ₹27cr deposit

The special SEBI court permitted stock broker Ketan Parekh to travel to Thailand (November 5-9) and UAE (November 18-28) for a family vacation and wedding, respectively, after rejecting his earlier plea due to SEBI rule violations. Parekh, previously allowed travel from December 2014 to March 2025 and January 2021 to June 2023, was found to have wrongfully gained Rs65.77 crore. After depositing Rs 38.70 crore, Parekh's defense argued for travel permission. citing joint liability and prior court approvals. The court granted permission, contingent on Parekh depositing Rs27 crore or equivalent security with SEBI, despite objections from SEBI counsel.



Grahak The Mumbai Panchayat (MGP) has welcomed the Bombay High Court's October 17 order. which criticised the District Deputy Registrar, H (West) ward, for issuing a 'No Objection Certificate' (NOC) for a housing society's redevelopment without legal authority. Justice Amit Borkar clarified that under the Maharashtra Co-operative Societies Rules, 1961, the Registrar lacks the power to mandate NOCs for redevelopment, their role being limited to ensuring transparency and member participation. The directed Commissioner Cooperation to issue a circu-

lar by November 6, instructing all Registrars to comply. Complying, Commissioner Deepak Tavare issued a circular on Tuesday, stating: "No proposals or applications regarding No Objection

Certificates for the redevelopment of cooperative housing societies should be invited, accepted, or acted upon." It warned of disciplinary action for non-compliance.

MGP Chairman Advocate Shirish Deshpande's press release, titled "The Edifice of Redevelopment Corruption Has Collapsed," alleged that Deputy Registrars, citing a 2019 Government Resolution, demanded bribes Rs15,000-Rs50,000 per flat for NOCs. Despite MGP raising this corruption issue earlier, no action was taken. The MGP now demands a probe into the alleged crores in corrupt earnings and action against errant officials.


